Alberta Government is Supporting Safe Faith Community Gatherings

On November 9, the Alberta government announced that it is investing \$1 million to help faith-based and cultural organizations recover costs associated with COVID-19. From hosting online events, to facility upgrades and offering PPE, faith-based and cultural community groups have persevered to continue bringing hope, joy and connection to their communities. The new Faith-based and Cultural Facility Relaunch Grant will provide funding to offset costs related to following public health measures to ensure important religious and cultural gatherings can continue safely. Alberta Chinook Winds Northern Spirit Student Bursary Fund Society

The Student Bursary Fund Society (formerly the Alberta and Northwest Conference Student Bursary Fund Society) is beginning the process to formally close the Society as an Alberta Society and an Incorporated Ministry of The United Church of Canada. No Room in the Inn

We have received information about to this year’s No Room in the Inn campaign, a project of the Edmonton & District Council of Churches (EDCC). This year the project will support two women’s shelters in downtown Edmonton, operated by Catholic Social Services. TUXIS Parliament of Alberta

In December this year, the TUXIS Parliament of Alberta will hold its annual 5-day Winter Session in a new virtual format, giving youth from across the province a chance to partake in parliamentary debate, write resolutions, learn leadership skills and connect with peers despite the raging pandemic. The young people usually conduct their model parliament in the Legislative Assembly, but this year the session will take place on-line, and will involve no financial cost. Senator Paula Simons will preside over the opening

of parliament as the Lieutenant Governor, and read the Speech from the Throne. Matthew Boonstra, the Premier chosen by his peers to lead the parliament this year, will then initiate the debate on the Speech from the Throne. The government usually survives this debate, although Leader of the Opposition, Yuvraj Singh, may have other ideas. There follows discussion and voting on resolutions proposed by the Cabinet members. According to Boonstra, "TUXIS creates a space for safe dialogue, where every viewpoint on the spectrum can be discussed. And, instead of polarizing people, these conversations create a space to find understanding and expand our views." Singh agrees, and stresses the skills that youth build as a part of the once in a lifetime experience.
