Coming Soon: Changes for this E-Newsletter

Save the Dates! Pastoral Relations Liaison Training Workshops

The Regional Council will be offering 3 workshops in February which we hope all ministry personnel and interested lay leaders will attend. We are hoping the material we cover will not only explain to Liaisons and ministry personnel how to guide Communities of Faith in creating their Profiles, but also help ministry personnel to understand what they are seeing when they search for a new position. And now that ChurchHub is developed and stabilizing, we can actually tell people how it works (more or less), and show how access by ministry personnel and Communities of Faith differs. The workshops are 90 minutes long (7:00 pm to 8:30 pm MST), and are scheduled as follows:

Session One: Wednesday, February 9th: All Communities of Faith are to have a “Living Faith Story” posted in their ChurchHub account. What is it? Who writes it? And, where do they start?

Session Two: Wednesday, February 16th: Applications, Interviews and Negotiations! Need we say more?

Session Three: Wednesday February 23rd: Guiding a Community of Faith on using ChurchHub. What does their account look like? What’s in there (statistics!)? And, how does it work?

Just log into your account on churchhub.ca to get started. (Remember that Chrome or Edge are preferred browsers for ChurchHub; Safari is not optimal). If you make your mandatory Annual Declaration (about whether you’ve had criminal charges in the last year or not) each year, you do not need to get a new police records check! Continuing Work on the TRC, Residential Schools and Burials

The national church has grouped all resources together on one page, [Bringing the Children Home](#). Please have a look for an overview of our church's national commitments, and the work that lies ahead. In related, and good, news, the government of Alberta recently announced it will [review and postpone proposed changes to the Alberta K-6 curriculum](#). The Regional Council called for this at its last annual meeting, out of strong concerns that the proposed social studies curriculum, in particular, did not respect commitments Alberta made to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission regarding respectful teaching of Indigenous histories and the residential school system.
