They're Almost Here! Changes for this E-Newsletter (Updated)

Have a Heart Day

From now through February 14, all United Church Communities of Faith are invited to take some time by February 14 to mark a different kind of Valentine's Day. Have a Heart Day is a project of the First Nations Child and Family Caring Society. Led by Dr. Cindy Blackstock, this non-profit organization works with Indigenous and non-Indigenous people of all ages to educate about, and advocate for, the rights of Indigenous kids across Canada, working directly with Indigenous kids and communities to do this. Have a Heart Day is about kids, and we hope non-Indigenous kids can learn about the different experiences of kids in Canada and take action out of a sense of compassion. 2022 World Day of Prayer Service Planning

World Day of Prayer 2022, with the theme, *I Know the Plans I Have for You* (based on Jeremiah 29:1-14), will be **Friday, March 4**. World Day of Prayer is a movement that invites us to enrich our faith experience with those of Christians from other countries and cultures, and to bring hope to women touched by injustice. This year's service was written by the World Day of Prayer Committee of England, Wales and Northern Ireland. Pastoral Relations Liaison Training Workshops (Updated)

The Regional Council is offering 3 workshops in February which we hope all ministry personnel and interested lay leaders will attend. The material covered will not only explain to Liaisons and ministry personnel how to guide Communities of Faith in creating their Profile, but also help ministry personnel to understand what they are seeing when they search for a new position. Now that ChurchHub is developed and stabilizing we can actually tell people how it works (more or less), and show how ministry personnel and Community of Faith accounts differ. The workshops are 2 hours in length (7:00 pm to 9:00 pm MST), and are scheduled as follows:

Session One: Wednesday, February 9th: All Communities of Faith are to have a "Living Faith Story" posted in their ChurchHub account. What is it? Who writes it? And, where do they start? **Session Two: Wednesday, February 16th:** Applications, Interviews and an assorted variety of pitfalls and possibilities!

Session Three: Wednesday February 23rd: Guiding a Community of Faith on using ChurchHub. What does their account look like? What's in there (statistics!?)? And, how does it work? Korea Peace Appeal: Our Partners Ask us to Bring our Voices (Updated)

The Korean War began in 1950. While open clashes ceased in 1953 with the signing of an armistice, a peace treaty has not yet been established and the war is <u>not</u> over. For more than 70 years, the Korean people have endured a constant state of hostility and war. The <u>Korea Peace Appeal</u> is a global campaign that seeks to collect 100 million signatures by 2023, the 70th anniversary of the armistice. The National Council of Churches in Korea, a longtime United Church partner, has challenged The United Church of

Canada to add ten thousand signatures by the summer of 2022. Click here for the full information and a link to the petition. Moderator Richard Bott and the Rev. Dr. Kyongia (Kay) Cho will be hosting a special Korea Peace Appeal Ten Thousand Signature Campaign information session on Thursday, February 24, at 12:00 noon (MST), to encourage and support uptake of this campaign. As well, there is a <u>special opportunity</u> for young adults aged 18-30 to participate in Korea Peace Encounter with young adults from Korea, the United States, and Canada. The deadline to apply is **February 9**.

Both North and South Korea have used the conflict as an excuse to perpetuate violations of human rights to maintain power, countless resources have been focused on military spending rather than on people's health and welfare, and millions of Korean families remain separated from each other on opposite sides of the border sealed in 1953. Yet, the people of Korea have not lost hope. May we join our voices with theirs in this global call for true peace.

Just log into your account on churchhub.ca to get started. Remember, Chrome or Edge are preferred browsers for ChurchHub; Safari is not optimal. If you make your mandatory Annual Declaration (about whether you've had criminal charges in the last year or not) each year, you do not need to get a new police records check! Supporting Equitable Access to Vaccines for All Our Neighbours

As many Canadians begin to see the way out of the COVID-19 pandemic through vaccines, The United Church of Canada is adding a <u>vigorous advocacy campaign</u> to its <u>COVID-19 Global Response</u> and continuing to ask people to financially support global partners dealing with the ongoing pandemic. ACT Alliance, a global coalition of churches, notes that Global South nations will reach herd immunity levels only in 2024, if ever. The new chapter of the COVID-19 Global Response appeal asks people to <u>advocate</u> with the Canadian government for more vaccine sharing; <u>donate</u> to the ongoing appeal; and show solidarity by <u>buying a vaccine</u> for someone in the Global South (you can do this as a gift, and even choose when the gift is delivered. <u>Click here for the summary page</u>.
