## The Rev. Dr. Donald Laing

We received notification of the death of the Rev. Dr. Donald Laing on March 29, 2022. In 1958, Don graduated from St. Andrew's College, Saskatoon, and received his M.Div. in 1960. Later he received a S.T.M. degree from Vancouver School of Theology, and his Ph.D. from the University of St. Andrews, Scotland. Don was ordained in The United Church of Canada in 1958, and served United Churches in Leask, Cabri, Regina, Saskatoon, and Moose Jaw, SK, before serving at Robertson-Wesley United Church, Edmonton. After retirement, he was made Minister Emeritus of St. Andrew's United Church, Moose Jaw. Don held many church positions, including President of Saskatchewan Conference, Chair and Vice-Chair of the Board, and Interim President of St. Andrew's College. As part of our commitment to the 94 Calls to Action of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada, the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, and the Caretakers' Calls to the Church, The United Church of Canada is seeking the wisdom of the Elders' Council and National Indigenous Council as to how we might respond. ### **Letter Concerning Ukraine: United Church Ethnocultural Networks**

Members of the United Church Ethnocultural Networks have written an open letter to Communities of Faith, expressing deep concern over manifestations of racism in the midst of the war in Ukraine. News media have reported that Black and south Asian students have been hindered from leaving the country to find safety elsewhere, primarily because of their skin colour. Concern is also expressed over mainstream media coverage of the war in Ukraine to the neglect of other disturbing events and conflicts, nationally and globally. The letter invites United Church members and Communities of Faith to write to their respective MPs, asking the Canadian government to take steps to stop such expressions of racial discrimination. #### **Ukraine Appeal Update**

The extreme violence in Ukraine continues to be beyond words, as is the case for so many around the world who confront armed conflict in their communities. The United Church community has raised \$402,000 for humanitarian relief so far. Of that, \$240,000 has been sent via the ACT Alliance. Spanning 127 countries, the Action by Churches Together (ACT) Alliance is the world's largest network of Protestant and Orthodox churches and agencies, including the United Church. Your generosity through Mission & Service has long supported ACT's humanitarian relief and advocacy efforts.
