For Church Treasurers and Payroll Administrators: Travel Reimbursement News

The United Church General Secretary, Michael Blair, has extended the temporary travel reimbursement rate of \$0.46/km until December 31, 2022. The General Council Executive is also reviewing the rate for 2023, as well as the 2023 Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA). Stay tuned for more information once it becomes available.

Action Invitation Following Israeli Army Raid of Human Rights Offices

Canada needs to hold Israel accountable for its mistreatment of children in Palestine and for silencing organizations that advocate on their behalf. As the war against Ukraine has shown, Canada can and does speak out against other human rights violations when it chooses to. The government of Israel has recently criminalized seven organizations that work tirelessly to relieve beleaguered Palestinians, including thousands of children. In the dawn hours of August 18, 2022, the government sent its army to raid the offices and confiscate the property of seven Palestinian human rights and civil society organizations: <u>Defense for Children International – Palestine (DCI-P); Al-Haq; Addameer Prisoner</u> Support and Human Rights Association; <u>Bisan Centre for Research and Development; The Union of Agricultural Work Committees (UAWC); and The Union of Palestinian Women's Committees, Health Work Committees.</u> The United Church is a partner of Defense for Children International-Palestine.
