### ★ CCS Fridays: March 31st, "Addiction and Faith"

Ed Treat from the Centre of Addiction and Faith believes churches are poised to make a dent in the opioid crisis because we have locations in tiny rural communities that may not have other local supports like a doctor or social worker available in town. He'll help us explore the scope for developing an addiction ministry team that takes actions such as providing resources on addiction in libraries, getting narcan training, and training people to support those living with or recovering from addiction. We'll have a chance to explore addiction and recovery in a Biblical text. The Centre of Addiction and Faith is committed to helping ministers and leaders learn how faith communities can better understand addiction, and to better address the spiritual needs of those afflicted. #### 2023 Outdoor Way of the Cross: April 7, 10 a.m.

The Outdoor Way of the Cross is an ecumenical prayer event marking the suffering and death of Jesus. The 43rd annual Outdoor Way of the Cross invites people to think about the relevance and importance of the Gospel message in our world today. This year's theme, "Hope in the Midst of Crisis," is based on Micah 6:8: "*And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."* The walk will once again take place in person, along the streets of Edmonton's inner city. People of all faith traditions are welcome. The 2 km walk is reasonable for most ages and levels of fitness and ability. Free street parking is available near the start location.
