Pastoral Charge Supervisors & Liaisons: Policy Update and Call for Volunteers

- The Northern Spirit Pastoral Charge Supervisor Policy has been updated. Key changes include specifications around appointing Lay Pastoral Charge Supervisors, and Retired Ministers to their former Pastoral Charges. Please note that as of January 1, 2024, all Pastoral Charge Supervisors should be reimbursed for their time & effort with \$30 per hour of work on the Pastoral Charge's behalf, in addition to having their travel costs reimbursed by the Pastoral Charge. For any active ministers, this should be paid in the form of an honorarium. Click here to read the full updated policy. (Last Newsletter incorrectly said this policy would come into effect on January 1, 2023 this was a typo: 2024 is the correct year. Thanks to those who noticed!)
- The Region is in need of both Supervisors and Liaisons. Training is being offered, and no previous experience is necessary. *Pastoral Charge Supervisors* support Charges who do not currently have appointed or called ministry personnel, by acting as a resource and attending governing body meetings (in-person or online) (Manual I.2.5.2). *Pastoral Relations Liaisons* assist Charges with Pastoral Relations processes by supporting Community of Faith Profile and Search Teams (this does not require being on those teams) (Manual I.1.5.3). Both roles can often be carried out by phone, email, and Zoom. ★ Please support calls for an immediate ceasefire between Israel and Hamas

Urgent action is required to prevent further mass death of civilians in Gaza. The United Church and many other groups are <u>calling for an immediate ceasefire in the battle between Israel and Palestinian paramilitary group Hamas</u>. 2.3 million civilians are trapped in the middle, including over 200 Israelis and international citizens taken captive by Hamas October 7. <u>Please click here for a simple urgent action to the federal government</u>, and further background to help us hear what global partners living through this terrible violence are saying.

★ Remit update: Letter to pastoral charge boards sent; online learning coming up Nov 23

If you are involved in the governance of your pastoral charge, your chair, secretary, Regional Council lay delegate, and minister or Pastoral Charge Supervisor should have received a letter. Currently a Category 3 Remit is before the church, focused on creating space for a National Autonomous Indigenous Organization within the United Church of Canada. Every Regional Council and every Pastoral Charge governing body has the right and responsibility to vote between now and 31 March 2024. Didn't receive it? See below. The Regional Council has created a resource page to help your process of learning, listening, and deciding. Between now and February, the Regional Council will also offer open online learning circles, and we hope we will see you there. Please bear in mind that if your governing body does not vote on this Remit, that will be counted as a No vote. We urge you to ensure that your Council or Board votes! *Questions? Concerns? ★ Treaty Land Sharing Network on the Alberta side of Treaty Sixlandholders sought

The <u>Treaty Land Sharing Network</u> is thrilled to announce that they will be formally **expanding to the Alberta side of Treaty 6 in 2024.** "Since shortly after we launched in 2021 we have been in discussion with a committed group of people there who have formed an Alberta working group, and, earlier this year, completed a successful pilot project in the <u>Beaver Hills Biosphere</u> east of Edmonton. We are busy updating our outreach materials, printing more signs, applying for grants, and connecting with potential members. **If you know of any landholders in Alberta** who may be interested in joining the network, please send them our way!"
