Our truth and reconciliation work relies on both our own commitments and guidance from Indigenous people and communities, and in that journey there are some people who are exceptionally generous with their time and wisdom. The late Elder Charles Wood, Saddle Lake Cree Nation, was one. He built countless bridges to non-Indigenous communities, including years of work related to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, and accompaniment with the Being Good Relations Network, now shared between Indigenous communities of faith, Northern Spirit and Chinook Winds. We will deeply miss his presence with us at meetings and gatherings, his living out of the Seven Sacred Teachings, and his example to us all. We have until 31 March 2024 to submit our voting results, and you are respectfully encouraged to remember that not voting at all is recorded automatically as a No vote. ★ Upcoming Stewardship Online Courses

A great place to kick-start your stewardship work is through one of our programs. Here is what is upcoming:

Setting Up Your Giving Program – Starts the week of January 16 and requires a team (3-5 people) to participate. This course is designed for you to develop the resources you need to get your Congregational Giving Program off the ground! <u>To register or learn more click here</u>.

Communicating Impact: Narrative Budgets and Storytelling at your AGM -Tuesday, January 23 at 2pm Mountain & 3pm Central. This 60-minute session for church leaders--both clergy and lay--will talk about how communities of faith can better communicate their amazing impact during their annual meeting and through annual reports. Stewardship Best Practices - is a 9-session deep dive into the spiritual practice of stewardship.
