A letter was sent to all pastoral charges from General Secretary Rev Michael Blair last week. The Regional Council also sent a letter this week. Both have important reminders and resources on the Remit on creating an autonomous Indigenous organization within the United Church. The Regional letter also has an invitation to another learning time (see this newsletter for details). You are urged to set a date for a vote if you have not done so already. Next, the Regional Council will move into beginning to call pastoral charges who have not voted.

In order to vote, you will need your Mission and Service number or your Community of Faith ID. Your Mission and Service number can be found in your ChurchHub account or in your PAR info, if you use PAR. When you sign into your ChurchHub.ca, your Community of Faith ID number should be in the upper right-hand corner of your screen. If either of these aren't set up for you or just don't work, don't hesitate to call the office and we'll help.
