Edmonton's 44th Annual Good Friday Outdoor Way of the Cross: "Journeying Home", Good Friday, March 29, 10 a.m., Edmonton AB, Beginning at 99 Street and 107 Avenue.

The Outdoor Way of the Cross is an ecumenical prayer event marking the suffering and death of Jesus. The 44th annual Outdoor Way of the Cross invites people to think about the relevance and importance of the Gospel message in our world today. This year's theme, "Journeying Home," is based on Isaiah 58:6-7: "*Is not this the fast that I choose. . .to share your bread with the hungry and bring the homeless into your house.* "*People of all faith traditions are welcome. The 1.5 kilometer walk is reasonable for most ages and ability levels . Free street parking is available near the start location. Light refreshments will be provided at Hope Mission (106 Avenue and 99 Street) after the final station.
