# ★ Adaptive Leadership Workshop Opportunity for Ordained Ministry Personnel: May 29, 9am - 3 pm, Edmonton

This one-day in-person workshop will help ordained ministry personnel explore the adaptive challenges that are facing the church, and equip them with new leadership skills to address these challenges. **All in-service ordained ministry personnel in Edmonton and area are invited to participate.** There is no cost to attend, and lunch will be provided.

The workshop is offered as part of a doctoral research study taking place across Canada in 2024 and 2025 led by Rev. Clara King (ClaraKing.com), which is testing a new way to teach adaptive leadership to clergy. ### **★** Remit voting is finished; next steps

Voting on the autonomous Indigenous organization within the United Church closed March 31, and General Council has a ten-day window after that to allow receipt of any mailed-in ballots, which will be counted as long as they were post-marked by March 31. We anticipate results will be announced after April 10, via the national newsletter

E-ssentials. The Region will also use its own channels to make sure everyone receives the communication. Thank you to all who voted, and to all who facilitated and participated in courageous and honest conversations and decisions on this significant question. Our work together continues. No matter what, we in the majority non-Indigenous church remain in relationship with Indigenous United Church members and their communities, as the body of Jesus. We carry the Apologies and commitments of our ancestors in faith, and commitments made by the whole country, to change that shared relationship from one shaped by domination and colonization to one of justice, sharing, mutual respect, and love. We will plan more conversations together.

### ★ Proposals to the Regional Council meeting, May 2 and 9<sup>th</sup>

Proposals to the Regional Council or to General Council are the main avenue for asking the church to adopt policy positions or take specific and relevant action. They use a template for consistency, and to ensure that all the needed information for representatives or commissioners is included. **The Regional Council proposals template is now updated and ready for use.** Please click here for the <u>Proposals PDF overview</u> (best for sharing and reviewing) and <u>click here for the Word version</u> (best for copying and pasting into a new document so you can build your proposal with the correct information and format.) ### **★** Upcoming Stewardship Online Courses

A great place to kick-start your stewardship work is through one of our programs. Here is what is upcoming:

**Getting Started in Stewardship** – April 10 at 3pm or 5:30pm Central Time (2pm or 4:30 Mountain). Come on your own, or come with a team and join United Church people from across the country to learn some stewardship first principles. This 90 minute course is the place to start if you are new to stewardship or need a refresher. Register or learn more right here.

From Fear to Faith: How to talk about money in church - Thursday, April 25 at noon Mountain & 1pm Central. This 60 minute session is for church leaders—both clergy and lay—to unpack some of the fears we have around talking about money and giving in church. Let's chat how we can move from scarcity, secrecy, obligation, and transaction towards abundance, transparency, joy and transformation. # ★ Being Right Relations Network News: plan ahead for these important upcoming dates

The Being Right Relations Network encompasses both Chinook Winds and Northern Spirit Regions. Two important Indigenous Special Days occur in May. We urge all United Churches to honour these two days and try to educate people in your community.

May 5 - Red Dress Day: Red Dress Day honours the memories of missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls across Canada. In 2010 Métis artist Jaime Black helped inspire the red dress movement, where red dresses are hung from windows and trees to represent the pain and loss felt by loved ones and survivors. **May 16 Moose Hide Day:** Moose hide Campaign is a grass roots movement for Indigenous and Non-Indigenous men and boys who are standing up against violence towards women and girls. It's a day of ceremony where all Canadians are called together to take a stand against violence towards women and children and to take practical steps for our collective journey of reconciliation.
