Fall Rally at Rundle's Mission

On September 18, Twenty-two Women of the United Church gathered for a fall rally at Rundle's Mission, the theme being "What Influences Your Life?" The women of Millet, MaMeO, Mulhurst and Wetaskawin hosted. We were greeted with smiles, muffins, tea and coffee.

The ladies had not met since 2019. Pat Hughes from Millet welcomed everyone. Eileen Lange of MaMeO was secretary. Terry Blois, Lesley Janke, and Linda Maki from Stony Plain led the morning and afternoon sing song.

Board member, Cindy, from Rundle's Mission, told us that everything was on hold at the Centre since 2019 as well. Programs resumed slowly in 2022. The fund-raising for the new elevator is still far short of the needed amount. 144 acres were donated by the Hutchinson family and the walking trails are being extended. The Centre has cabins for rent to groups or families. Check out their website https://rundlesmission.org/ The mission has been part of Alberta for 175 years, since Robert Rundle established a mission in 1847. It is \$20 to become a member and new members are encouraged.

Stony Plain ladies conducted the morning worship service. The offering, after expenses, was donated to Rundle Mission for the elevator fund.

A short business meeting concluded that next year we will have a Women's Fall Rally in Stony Plain and Leduc will host in 2025.

A Memorial Service was led by Peggy Lunde for 35 ladies who passed away since the 2019 rally. They were each remembered with a butterfly posted on a blue back ground.

Everyone brought their own lunch which we shared by moving to tables where we met new friends. Some ladies took the opportunity to go outside, walk down to the lake, or check out the walking trails.

Our after lunch speaker was Darlene McPherson, from ATB Financial: Calmar, Warburg and Millet Agency. Her topic was Scams and Frauds. She gave us a good overview of what traps lie waiting for us. She introduced us to phishing which looks like a legitimate email; vishing which appears to be a legitimate phone call from a legitimate organization; and smishing which seems to be a legitimate text, also known as SMS phishing. She explored psychological manipulation, emergency scams and identity theft with us. Her final tip was to not use the free WiFi at Tim Horton's to do your online banking. Someone at the next table could steal your banking information.

Each community of Faith brought a poem or story which they shared and we ended with a monologue by Leduc. After the benediction we all had a sunny, fall drive home, planning to meet again next year.

POSITIONS NEEDING TO BE FILLED. At WUC — Chinook Winds & Northern Spirit.

There are a number of positions which need to be filled if our joint Regional area is to continue. Please consider accepting one of the positions , as it makes the work much easier for all concerned, when we all do our part. It might not take up as much time as you think, or you might not need to travel as often or as far as you think. If you consider one of these positions, you may be able to delegate, and therefore share the load with someone else.

Sometimes we don't like to volunteer, but we like to take part in our groups, and if we have NO one to help arrange these little treats, we will need to disband, becoming the first area in the new structure to have no representation at the National Level.

At the National level, all areas of the Church, discuss and work out where the UCW is going, and how we are going to reach our goals. Meeting and mixing with the women from across the country, helps us in our endeavours to be the United Church Women. We have lots of fellowship, networking and great ideas that we work on, we also have speakers both from the National Church and from lay workers explaining how we work within the United Church and with the United Church to help obtain our goals.

The National UCW sets out our objectives, and how we will work to obtain them. Friendships both lifelong and short term are forged, and we remember that WE ARE IMPORTANT, that we ARE COUNTED, and that WE ARE SOME-BODY!

National UCW Project.

The previous NUCW Project (Women for Change) has ended, and a new Project was to be discussed and decided on at the National Meeting. Below, please see the outcome of that discussion and the decision made.

UCW FIVE YEAR SPECIAL PROJECT SELECTION: This year's NUCW Executive were challenged to select the next Five-Year Special Project from a list of four possible options.

This next Special Project follows on the success of our 55^{th} Anniversary partnership choice -- Women for Change – Zambia. **THE HEALING FUND** - Women and Children, was selected for partnership with United Church Women as our next Five-year Special Project 2022 - 2027, to conclude at the 65^{th} UCW Anniversary celebration.

CAMP CHESTERMERE

Would you like to attend an all day meeting on the shore of Lake Chestermere, located just east of Calgary on the TransCanada Highway?

If your answer is YES, then we have a treat in store for you!

The Former Foothills Presbyterial (We need a new name) are holding a "Meeting and Greeting" day on 6th April of 2024 at Camp Chestermere. It will be an all day event, with a **meeting** to plan and sort the UCW business. We will have **speakers**, and that all important **greeting**, where we can mix and mingle with our neighbours throughout the area.

Registration will be required, this helps us with catering numbers, and a small fee will be applied.

Allocation: What it is and why it's needed

Allocations are the money (\$2000.00) that each Presbyterial used to send to the Alberta Northwest Conference UCW Treasurer since the beginning of the organization. It has been used to cover the expenses of the Annual General Meetings, Annual Reports, Directories, honorarium for guest speakers and/or worship leaders, reimbursing mileage to executive members attending in-person meetings, office supplies, supplementing the cost of publishing the Banner Newsletter, M&S, overseas relief funds, special projects, etc., etc.

Over the last several years this amount has been greatly reduced, but some of it is still needed in order to continue the functioning of the organization. Since all but one of the old nine "Presbyterials" are no longer functioning as they used to, and we know that most Units are no longer able to do fundraising in order to raise the funds, we came up with a new way of meeting the need for collecting some of the said Allocation.

On April 30, 2021, at the Annual General Meeting by Zoom, we passed a motion saying: "We request each and every member of the Women of The United Church: Chinook Winds & Northern Spirit (aka ANW Conference UCW) pay \$11.00 per year/member to 'Women of The United Church', of which \$1.00 will go towards National Women's Travel Fund and \$10.00 towards allocation. This money can be collected by each Unit, but contributed by each member, or paid by their Unit itself, whichever they see fit. However, if any member finds the \$10.00 too much, they are welcome to contribute whatever they can".

This means that the responsibility lays on each and every UCW unit that is still functioning, (under the old or the new name) and is asked to contribute something towards the much needed funds. For example: If your Unit has 10 members you would send \$110.00, which would be shared with the National Women's Travel Fund, as explained above. Or, if your Unit is still very active and can afford to send more, that is most welcome too. We also ask that the Contact Person of each Area remind you of this each year and further explain it to you, if needed.

As the treasurer of Women of The United Church of both Regions 2 and 3, I thank you for your cooperation and support. Christensen/Dryburgh Memorial, Education and Travel fund.

This fund supports travel to an event within Alberta and Northwest Territories, covering both Regions -2 & 3. At the discretion of the Revue Committee, it may also be used to attend at places/events outside the borders of our two Regions – Chinook Winds and Northern Spirit. Events should be of an educational/ Leadership quality for use within one's home church; events could be of an ecumenical, mission, interfaith, spiritual, youth or outreach interest. Funding is on a $1/3^{rd}$ basis – 1/3 personnel, 1/3 supporting congregation or committee and 1/3 from the Fund to a maximum of \$500. Application forms maybe obtained only through the Banner or by contacting the administrator.

The new application form (on the previous page) is the new and revised form. It is shorter and simpler. We advise you to use this form when you are seeking financi8al assistance for an event. I will be more than happy to send you a copy for you to fill and return to me. While we have cut out some of the other documents that you had to send, with the old form, we do need this one for our Records, as an expense form.

If you are planning to attend the upcoming 60th Anniversary Celebration in the summer and you choose to apply, we will assist you with a flat rate of \$150. However, you have to apply prior to the event, and you will receive the cheque after you return. We encourage you to apply. Money is there to assist you.
