

* Adaptive Leadership Workshop Opportunity for Ordained Ministry Personnel: *May 29, 9am - 3 pm, Edmonton*

This one-day in-person workshop will help ordained ministry personnel explore the adaptive challenges that are facing the church, and equip them with new leadership skills to address these challenges. All in-service ordained ministry personnel in Edmonton and area are invited to participate. There is no cost to attend, and lunch will be provided!

The workshop is offered as part of a doctoral research study taking place across Canada in 2024 and 2025 led by Rev. Clara King (ClaraKing.com), which is testing a new way to teach adaptive leadership to clergy.
