Activity Suggestions for Communities of Faith

I) Storytelling

Based on the Centennial Monthly Themes, hold storytelling times with your Community of Faith. Gather together in a circle or at a podium, in small groups or all together, and share the stories that resonate from your own past and the past of family and friends who are no longer with us. What memories and emotions do these themes bring up? How has your Community of Faith lived these themes? What stories do you want to share just with the people in the room, and what would you like to share with future folks?

If there is interest and ability, consider having a designated Storyteller(s) whose job it is to collect some or all of the stories in their entirety or in snippets. If you record the stories, then consider gathering volunteers to create written summaries or transcripts of them, so they can be preserved for future generations.

2) Photo Share

Does your Community of Faith have photos of the present and the past? If you do, are the photos described with the 5 W's: Who? What? When? Why? Gather together, pour a cup of tea, and try to name the people in your photos.

Bring in personal photos that you or your people have taken that embody Church life to you (and/ or the Monthly Themes), and share them with your community. Pass them around in a circle, post them on Facebook, make a PowerPoint, print a copy and tape it to a wall... there are lots of ways to share and collectively remember moments from our past. Consider contacting your provincial or territorial archives for photos of your community and church; look at the wider historical context of your area, or the country, as you investigate specific periods in your church's history.

Consider selecting some, describing them in detail, and sending a physical print copy (or the originals) to the Archives.

3) Review Your Archives

What archival records are held at your Community of Faith? Maybe folks would like to see old Bulletins, newsletters, or minutes? Remember that baptism, marriage, and burial records should not be shared publicly, for privacy reasons. Are records stored safely at your Community of Faith? If not, this year may be a good year to transfer them to the Archives. Contact the Archivists for further information about organizing records.
