★ Honouring Advent's radical roots: Resources on Palestinian human rights, event on avoiding anti-Semitism

As enormous violence continues in the Holy Land in Gaza and the West Bank, including Bethlehem, the United Network for Justice in Palestine and Israel is again offering an Advent candle-lighting liturgy for public worship and household prayers. These biblical places are real communities that today are gripped by immense violence and trauma, and our Christian family and human rights activists in Palestine are asking us not to erase their lived realities as we re-tell our sacred stories.

There is also a live national online event on Advent scripture and avoiding anti-Semitism coming up November 19 with Dr Amy-Jill Levine that will be a rich time of learning and discussion. Click here to register.

Update on United Church policy on Palestine and Israel

On October 19, the online meeting of General Council 44 adopted new policies related to Palestine and Israel. In summary, the United Church is: (1) adopting the strategies of Boycott, Divestment and Sanction (BDS) movement; and (2) responding positively to the request of NEW04 - Join the Apartheid Free Communities Movement; and (3) joining the consensus of the international human rights community in recognizing and rejecting Israel's apartheid system of laws and legal procedures towards the Palestinian people. These policies are an invitation to the entire church, not just the General Council, so we are all encouraged to be informed of the details.
