


News from the Region: January 8, 2025



Short reminders of our history for this Centennial year

Throughout 2025, we'll be featuring very short stories about United Church history. Many thanks to Gayle Simonson, a lay member of the United Church at Southminster Steinhauer in Edmonton, an experienced history researcher, and a writer who has written for historical journals and UCC publications. She is a key volunteer in the United Church archives for both Northern Spirit and Chinook Winds. Gayle's generosity means that we'll have frequent reminders of our history with a focus on ordinary people. To lead us off, she writes,

"As western Canada was settled, communities sprang up but populations remained sparse. It was difficult to sustain a church congregation, so many churches of different denominations came together to form union churches. As the idea spread, denominations were encouraged to look at amalgamation. By 1925, Methodists, Presbyterians and Congregationalists had agreed and the United Church of Canada was formed by an act of parliament; in the end, not all Presbyterian congregations agreed to join, so they remain an ecumenical partner today.

Over the next year, we hope to present some highlights of our church history here in our Regional newsletters. We must not be bound by the past, but we do well to remember our history and to celebrate those who have brought us to this place."

★ Reminder for treasurers: Communicating salary changes to ADP ★

The 2025 Minimum Salaries and Reimbursements for Ministry Personnel document is now available online. You can find it in the Downloads section at the bottom of the Ministers' Salary Schedule and Cost of Living Groups webpage. The increases to salaries of ministry personnel are not automatically made by ADP. General Council Office staff do not update ADP with minimum salary data. Your pastoral charge ADP administrator must update the minister's salary in TeamPay or inform ADP of the new salary amount for the pay period beginning January 1.

Upholding Sacred Obligations: Final Report of the Special Interlocutor on Missing Children and Unmarked Burial Sites

On October 29, Kimberly Murray released her final report as the Special Interlocutor on Missing Children and Unmarked Burials. Her final report is an Indigenous-led framework for reparations and is <u>available to download</u>. You can also watch an overview of the report's findings, and how they relate to the United Church of Canada, in this 40 Days

of Anti-Racism presentation on <u>An Indigenous-Led Framework on Healing and Reparations</u>. This session also features a review of the United Church's <u>Healing Programs</u> and a brief update on the <u>Bringing the Children Home</u> initiative. The Regional Council is planning a late February in-person or hybrid event exploring this important report and the responsibilities of our church. More details to come.
