Short reminders of our history for this Centennial year

Throughout 2025, we'll be featuring very short stories about United Church history. Many thanks to Gayle Simonson, a lay member of the United Church at Southminster Steinhauer in Edmonton, an experienced history researcher, and a writer who has written for historical journals and UCC publications. She is a key volunteer in the United Church archives for both Northern Spirit and Chinook Winds. Gayle's generosity means that we'll have frequent reminders of our history with a focus on ordinary people. For our second vignette, she writes:

The Basis of Union to form the United Church of Canada was signed in 1925. Methodist Louise McKinney, an activist who was the first woman to sit in the Alberta legislature, was one of only four women to sign and the only one from western Canada. Along with Henrietta Muir Edwards, Nellie McClung, Irene Parlby and Emily Murphy, she was one of the "Famous Five" who, in 1929, had women in Canada declared as "Persons."

★ Rescind legislation targeting transgender people: Northern Spirit Executive letter to the AB government

The Regional Executive and the Affirming Committee have written a letter to the premier and relevant ministers calling for immediate rescinding of Bills 26, 27, and 29. These greatly limit transgender, Two Spirit, and gender diverse children and youth's access to appropriate medical care, sports, and correct naming, and greatly reduces all students' access to sexual health education everywhere in Alberta. It is possible that BC and NWT teams travelling to AB for tournaments will also be affected.

"We reject a society where the rights of some take precedence over the rights of others. Such a society is not in keeping with the commandment to love one another. Our faith leads us to condemn all three bills and their intended impacts. We believe Albertans want their government to treat all people equitably, to protect everyone's human rights, and to ensure anyone facing barriers to health care are provided with science-based treatments and support to navigate the medical system." ★ And over to you: action for people and communities of faith on AB bills 26, 27, and 29

This is your invitation to express your concerns about Alberta's Bills 26, 27, and 29 and their impacts on transgender children, youth, and loved ones. Following the lead of the letter from the Executive and the Affirming Committee, you are invited to write or call in your own response as a person of faith and a community of faith. ★ Updates from your Executive:

Centennial: That the NSRC Executive will be doing our Centennial reflections and celebrations in the midst of our in person annual meeting. Everyone in the region is invited to mark the Centennial in their own location and partner with neighbours for any other events. No one is tasked with coordinating other events but please use the Newsletter and website to promote your events and ideas.

Annual Meetings dates established into the future: The tri-region staff proposed, and the Executive agreed, that dates be established for our Regional Council's in-person annual meeting occur once every three years for the last weekend in May whenever possible (excepting when Pentecost falls on that weekend, etc). Celebrations of

ministries worship services will be held in person every year. Online annual meetings will be held in November, with one night for learning and discussing if there are proposals put forward, and one night for business. The agenda for online annual meetings will be restricted to necessary business. Additional spaces and gatherings can be planned separately addressing other pieces (education, support, etc). 2025 AGM: Save the date for the 2025 in-person Regional Annual Meeting, which will be held May 29 - June 1, at Riverbend United Church, Edmonton.

★ Reminder for treasurers: Communicating salary changes to ADP

The 2025 Minimum Salaries and Reimbursements for Ministry Personnel document is now available online. You can find it in the Downloads section at the bottom of the Ministers' Salary Schedule and Cost of Living Groups webpage. The increases to salaries of ministry personnel are not automatically made by ADP. General Council Office staff do not update ADP with minimum salary data. Your pastoral charge ADP administrator must update the minister's salary in TeamPay or inform ADP of the new salary amount for the pay period beginning January 1.
