

The stained glass will be installed to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the United Church of Canada, along with a free concert by members of the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra for installation dedication. ★ Orange Shirt/ Truth and Reconciliation Sunday 28 and Tuesday Sept 30 Please read and share this <u>summary from the national Indigenous church</u>.

On September 30, wear an orange shirt to say that Every Child Matters. And on September 28, mark <u>Orange Shirt Sunday</u> in your community of faith. This year in particular we ask you to honour the children with a <u>gift or special offering to the Healing Fund</u>, which supports initiatives for survivors of the residential school system and its ongoing intergenerational impacts.

On September 30, we also invite you to join in the <u>Remembering the Children: National Day for Truth and Reconciliation event</u> on Parliament Hill. This 90-minute program is a united effort of the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation, the Algonquin Nation, APTN, and CBC/Radio-Canada. It begins at 3:00 p.m. ET and all are welcome. Not near Ottawa? It will also be broadcast live on APTN and on YouTube.

The 2025 Fall Rally for the UC Women on **Saturday, September 13, 2025.** Registration 9:30 – 10 AM. The National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation invites us to join daily Lunch and Learn webinars – an immersive experience to UN-learn the myths of colonial history in Canada.
