The National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation invites us to join daily Lunch and Learn webinars – an immersive experience to UN-learn the myths of colonial history in Canada. ★ World Council of Churches Webinar: AI and Our Information Society—The Good, The Bad and The Ugly, *Oct* 15, 6 pm MT (8 pm ET), *online*

Join the <u>World Council of Churches Faith and Science Working Group</u> on October 15, 2025 at 8:00 p.m. ET, for a crucial discussion on the impact of artificial intelligence on communication, ministry, and advocacy. This timely webinar will explore the opportunities and challenges presented by AI, from its potential to democratize technology and boost creativity to its risks, including the spread of disinformation and the perpetuation of bias. <u>Registration is required to attend this webinar</u>. After almost 5 years of offering *Stewardship Best Practices* we have seen that congregations who participate in the course, and do the follow up work see higher giving and morale—teams report to us optimism about their ministry and hopes for the future.
