In honour of Truth and Reconciliation Day, a blanket exercise will be held at St Albert United church on Wednesday Oct  $15^{th}$ at 6:30 pm. The fee is \$10.00 per person. The blanket exercise program was designed by Indigenous Elders as an interactive opportunit to learn more about Canadian history and particularly the perspectives of the First Nation, Metis and Inuit that have not been regularly taught or discussed. It has been updated to include the local history in partnership with the Michif cultural connections. The program lasts  $1\frac{1}{2}$  to 2 hours. Join the World Council of Churches Faith and Science Working Group on October 15, 2025 at 8:00 p.m. ET, for a crucial discussion on the impact of artificial intelligence on communication, ministry, and advocacy. This timely webinar will explore the opportunities and challenges presented by AI, from its potential to democratize technology and boost creativity to its risks, including the spread of disinformation and the perpetuation of bias.
